By registering your myki, you can

- Check your balance and travel history
- Instantly top up on the PTV app
- Protect your balance if your card is lost or stolen
- Set auto top up
- Manage up to 10 mykis

Mobile myki

Mobile myki is a a digital myki on your Android phone on the Google Wallet™ app. You can top up on the go, touch on and off with your phone and know your balance in real time.

To get started:

- Download Google Wallet™
- Follow the instructions within Google Wallet™ to set up your payment card
- Tap the blue "Add to Wallet" button and select Transport pass. Choose myki
- Choose myki Money or myki Pass
- Choose your fare product: Full fare, Child, Senior or General concession
- Finish the transaction and you're ready to travel!

Free Tram Zone

The city's Free Tram Zone includes the city centre and extends from Queen Victoria Market to Docklands, Spring Street, Flinders Street Station and Federation Square.

Don't touch on or off if you're just travelling in the city's Free Tram Zone. You don't need a myki card.

Remember to touch on if you're travelling beyond the Free Tram Zone.

City Circle Tram

Travel on the City Circle Tram is free as it runs entirely within the Free Tram Zone.

Ride the historic W Class trams on the City Circle and hear the stories of Melbourne.

- 9.30am and 5pm daily.
- Trams depart clockwise, every 12 minutes.
- No services Good Friday and Christmas Day.

Buy your myki card and top up

A full fare card costs \$6 and concession card types cost \$3.

You can buy your myki and top up at:

- hundreds of shops including all 7-Elevens
- myki machines at selected stations and stops
- premium station ticket offices
- PTV Hubs
- Quick Top Up machines (\$50 max myki Money)
- ptv.vic.gov.au or by calling 1800 800 007 (allow around 45 minutes for online top ups).

You can also top up with myki Money instantly using the PTV app on your mobile phone (NFC required).

Check if you're eligible for a concession card (Child, Senior and Concession) at ptv.vic.gov.au/concession

Choose myki Pass or myki Money

Depending on how often you travel, you can choose to top up with myki Pass or myki Money. Your card isn't locked to either, choose the best for you each time you top up.

You can have myki Money and a myki Pass on your card at the same time, but your card will use myki Pass first.

Your myki Pass won't work if your myki Money has a negative balance.

myki Money

If you travel occasionally, pay as you go. Load money onto your myki and it will calculate the lowest fare based on where you travel.

Your first touch on of the day creates a 2 hour fare. If you're still travelling after 2 hours, you'll be charged a daily fare.

myki Pass

If you travel often, top up with consecutive days. When you travel more than five days a week, you save with a myki Pass.



PTV app

The PTV app is packed with features to help you manage your myki and plan your journey across Melbourne or Victoria.

myki in regional Victoria

You need a myki card if you're travelling on:

- V/Line trains between metropolitan Melbourne and:
- Goornong and Raywood (Bendigo)
- Seymour
- Traralgon
- Waurn Ponds (Geelong)
- Wendouree (Ballarat)
- buses within Ballarat, Bendigo, Bacchus Marsh, Geelong, Seymour, Kilmore, Wallan and the Latrobe Valley.

Journeys that include travel outside of the myki zones require a paper ticket.

Using paper tickets in regional Victoria

You need a V/Line paper ticket if you're travelling beyond the myki boundary on:

- long distance trains to and from Bairnsdale,
 Albury, Shepparton, Echuca, Swan Hill, Ararat,
 Maryborough or Warrnambool
- all V/Line coaches.

You need a regional bus paper ticket if you're travelling on:

 many regional local buses that operate between towns.

You can buy your regional bus paper ticket on the bus.


If you're travelling with V/Line on long distance services, plan ahead and where available, make a reservation.

One way travel that includes free metropolitan travel for two hours either side of your V/Line journey.

Return

Return travel either on the same day or different dates between the origin and destination printed on the ticket. Includes free Metropolitan travel.

Extension tickets for myki pass

If you have a myki Pass and are travelling to/from a long distance station, you will still need to pick up a V/Line paper ticket from a myki enabled, staffed V/Line station or premium metropolitan station beforeyou travel.

Remember to hold onto your ticket for your entire journey. You need to show it as you travel, along with your concession card, if you have one.
