Bicycles, dogs (with the exception of animals identified by an Assistance Animal Pass) and surfboards are not allowed on train replacement buses.

### Ticketing

Where possible, you should touch on and off at the beginning and end of your journey. When catching train replacement buses, you can touch on and off at your connecting train station.

# Service changes from Monday 26 October

As part of Victoria's Big Build, we're removing 75 dangerous and congested level crossings, with 35 already gone. On the Upfield Line, we've nearly finished removing four level crossings.

From Monday 26 October to Sunday 1 November, buses replace trains between North Melbourne and Upfield while we finish building the new rail bridge.

## What we've been up to

While you've been on the bus, we've been building a rail bridge and removing the boom gates at Bell Street, Munro Street and Reynard Street in Coburg, and Moreland Road in Brunswick. We've also been building new stations at Moreland and Coburg.

As part of the project, we're also upgrading the Upfield Bike Path, landscaping and creating new open spaces.





# Moreland and Coburg station closures

When trains are back on the Upfield Line on Monday 2 November, Moreland and Coburg stations will remain closed and trains will run express through the stations.

During the station closures, replacement transport services will operate to connect passengers to train services.

The new Moreland and Coburg stations will open in December.
