# Buses replace trains on the Frankston Line

## Thursday 2 January to Thursday 30 January



## Plan ahead to avoid long delays

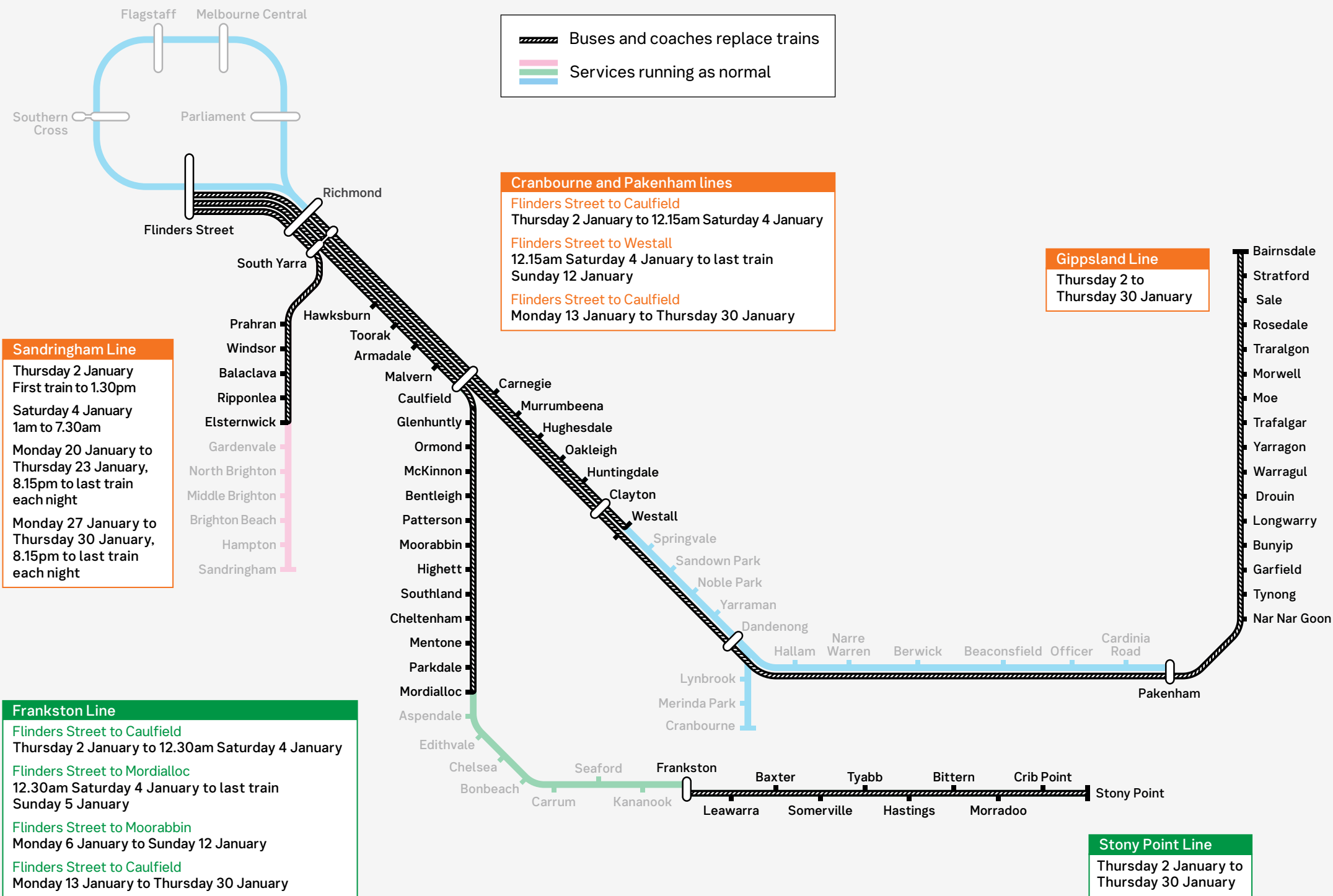
We're building big this summer. In January, buses replace trains on sections of the Frankston, Cranbourne, Pakenham and Gippsland lines for Metro Tunnel works. Buses also replace trains on sections of the Frankston Line from 2 February to 16 February for level crossing removal works in Cheltenham, Mentone and Carrum. Keep in mind, there are other disruptions on the public transport and road networks over summer.

During this major disruption, we're giving buses the green light. This means replacement buses will have a smoother journey along key routes, helping traffic flow and getting you where you need to be via the quickest route possible.

We estimate an additional 60 minutes will be added to most people's journeys. To help during this time, here are some tips:

- Plan ahead and allow more time for your journey.
- If you can, avoid the peak and consider alternatives where possible.
- Please be aware of more people using alternative roads, train lines or routes, if their usual journey is disrupted.
- Touch on and off on the metropolitan train network before 7.15am to get free travel.

Thanks for your patience as we deliver important works on Victoria's rail network for the Metro Tunnel.

The Metro Tunnel, Melbourne's next underground train line, will carry the busy Cranbourne, Pakenham and Sunbury lines and free up space in the City Loop. This means more trains can run more often on the Frankston Line, creating room for an additional 36,000 passengers in peak periods per week and saving up to 30 minutes travel time a day to key destinations. It will also help take cars off our busy roads.

Passengers heading to the Australian Open can catch the Express Service from Caulfield or speak to customer service staff about other travel options available.

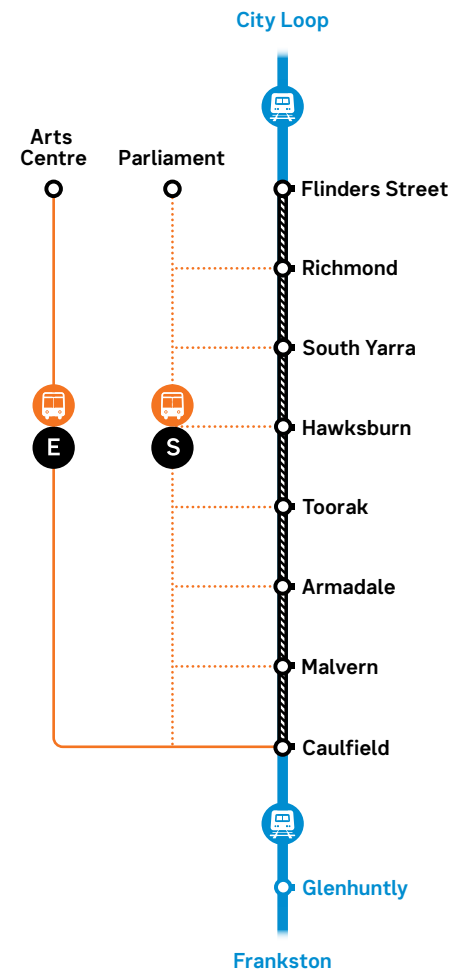

## Between Flinders Street and Caulfield

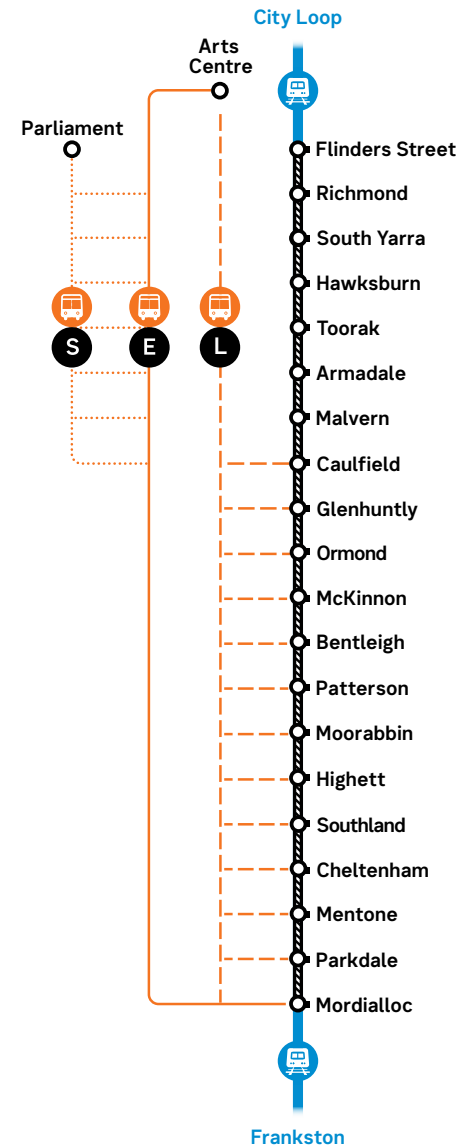

Monday 13 January to last train Thursday 30 January



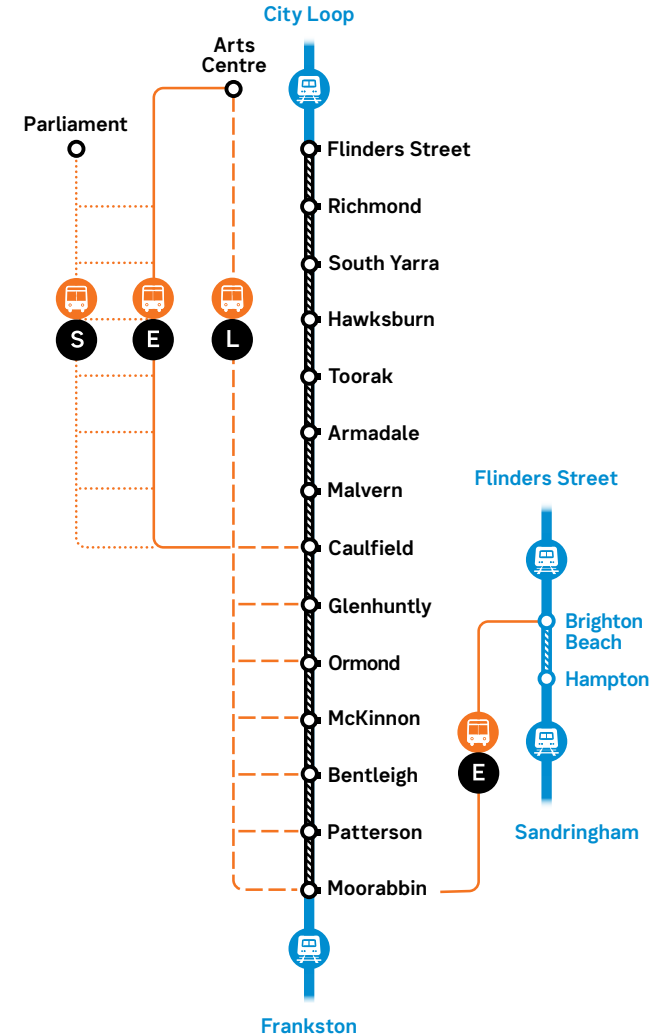
## Between Flinders Street and Mordialloc

## Between Flinders Street and Moorabbin

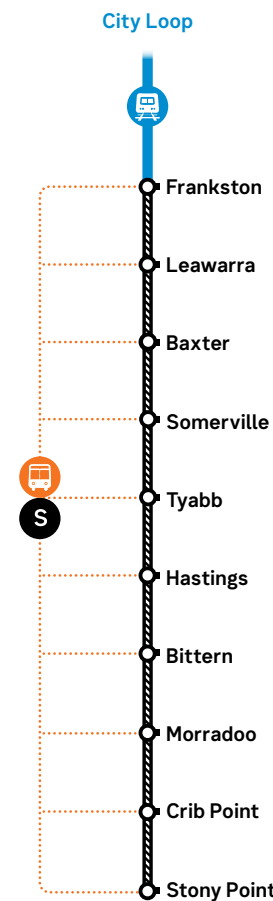
Monday 6 January to last train Sunday 12 January



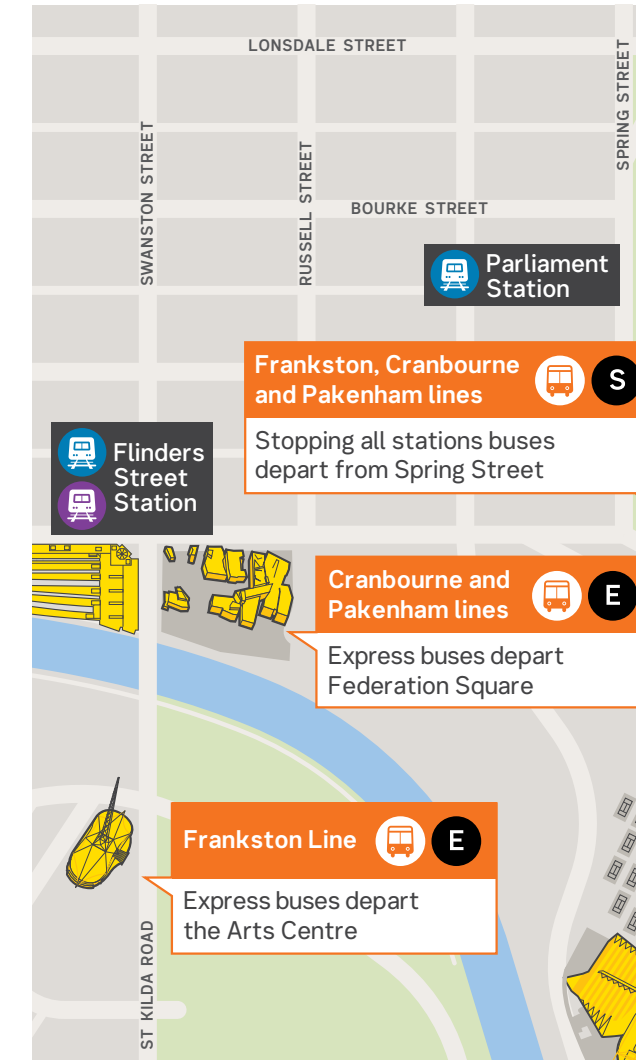
**Please note:** Passengers can catch the Express service from Moorabbin to Brighton Beach for Sandringham Line trains to the city. This is a weekday service only.

**Bikes and pets**   

Bicycles, dogs (with the exception of animals identified by an Assistance Animal Pass) and surfboards are not allowed on train replacement buses.

### Ticketing

Where possible, you should touch on and off at the beginning and end of your journey. When catching train replacement buses, you can touch on and off at your connecting train station.
